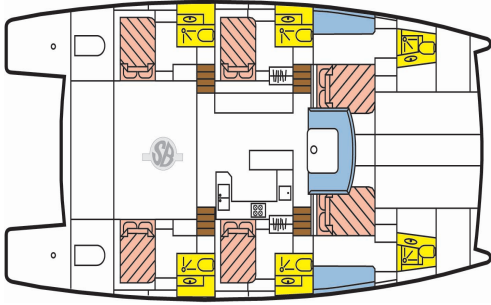


Cruise on one of the premium catamarans Catlante 600 or Catlante 620

You will sail on board of a gorgeous catamaran of type Catlante 600 or Catlante 620 for example, whose length is between 60 and 62 foot. It provides you comfort and stability. Each guest cabin possesses an "ensuite" bathroom (shower/lavatory).

One week full board with all non-alcoholic drinks! Table wine and cocktails based on rum are also included.

The menu can vary depending on the choice of the local markets as well as the results of the fishing.



Please note:

You will find a cook on board. However, he may have a couple of tasks to do at the same time. It is therefore greatly appreciated, if you take an active part in the life on board, helping in the kitchen and in the creation of the everyday life on the sailing yacht. Please remember that it is a sailing trip on a catamaran, not a cruise ship with a large crew. You may at any time victual yourself further to your liking. We do not mind if you bring any additional wine, beer or other alcoholic drinks on board.

Your catamaran has a saloon ("living room") with the kitchen integrated, as well as a cockpit which is protected from wind and strong sun. Most of the interactive life on board will take place here.



The skipper is very experienced and knows the local area and the boat extremely well. He will point out places of interest, bring you closer to the country and its inhabitants, and will show you the most beautiful bathing and snorkel areas. You will swim and snorkel in turquoise blue water, or relax on white beaches while the cook may be already preparing some steaks on the grill.

The cabin:

Example: Each yacht's guest cabins include a lavatory/showers with a basin. Please note that water on board

is not infinite, therefore it has to be handled with care. However, the store is large enough to ensure two showers per day for every guest.



The luggage:

The yachts are comfortable, yet the space in the cabins is limited. Therefore we would like to advise you to leave your hard suitcase at home and to use a carpetbag instead, for they are way easier to stash. If you would like to use a hard suitcase anyway, we will allow you a place where it may be kept.

Hints and references:

As the flight arrivals usually happen to be in afternoons or evenings, sailing will take place only in the following morning. The first evening is dedicated to getting to know other guests and to settle in. Keep in mind, that the guests arrive on different flights and therefore attain the boat at various times. However, we cannot be held responsible if the passenger arrives late due to delayed/cancelled flights.

You may use the same offer for a private journey, including friends and family only, for an additional charge. In this case, no other guests will be attending. For more information please contact your tour operator.

We would also like you to know, that pictures in the catalogue or on the homepage, do not necessarily show the boat which you have booked your sailing cruise on. Most of the pictures serve as an example. We prepare various catamarans for the cruises.



Worth knowing about the sailing trip:

It is necessary to get a valid passport or Identity Card (including a picture) to clear inward in the different islands. (People with non-EU citizenship please contact us).

You will have to pay the "on board cash" prior to embarkation. Following costs are balanced with the "on board cash": entrance fees for marina parks, isles, and gratuities for dock staff. Please refer to the current price list to know the amount of the "on board cash".

Even if your skin is used to the sun: note that on a boat the sun rays are more intense than on land. You will always have a nice breeze on when you are on the boat, therefore, the strong sun is often felt too late. Thus, it is even more important to be prepared, for it is very easy to get sunburnt or even get a sunstroke if you do not shield yourself from the sun. A sun hat which does not fall with the first gust of wind is very important. Do not forget your sunglasses either, which are best to be fixed with a string around your neck. A sweatshirt too is advisable, or a shirt with long sleeves combined with long trousers. For the first few days, sun cream with a high sun protection factor should be used.

If you take in medicine: remember to take enough of it with you from home. On the islands, it would be rather difficult to find pharmaceutical which is comparable.

No special vaccine required.

Seasickness: catamarans sail in a very stable way and are generally straight. Your skipper too will try his best to only pass through calm waters. In the Mediterranean sea, the water is usually calm. However, waves lie in the nature of sailing. If you are likely to get seasick, you can discuss with your pharmacist which medicines

are the best to take with you in this case.

Water on board is not infinite. The water is enough for every member to take two quick showers per day. In any case, your skipper will remind you to be diligent with the freshwater on board.

Sailing maneuvers and life on board:

To attend one of our sailing cruises, no knowledge about sailing and the handling of a boat are expected. People who are not sportive too can take part and get to know the beautiful islands in this way. The skipper who as a matter of course, is a skilled steersman who is capable of handling the yacht completely on his own. However, you have the chance to learn something about sailing even though it is not a trip organized for this cause. The skipper will love to share his passion for traveling on the seas with you. He will thus enjoy helping you to gain first-hand knowledge about sailing. If you like, you will very soon handle the steering-wheel, execute maneuvers or help with the anchoring yourself. Depending on the meteorological rates during your cruise, you will drive a section under engines. That means that the anchoring place will be reached by the engines and that the sails cannot be hoisted.

Mobile and Wifi on board:

Usually there is reception during the cruise, however this may not always be the case. You should contact your mobile provider prior to departure to inform yourself whether your sim-card is unlocked for the region and about any roaming charges that may apply. You can also purchase a Wifi- or Simcard on spot.

The cabins possess 220-volt connection. You can charge your mobile, photo camera, etc. in the receptacle in the saloon (Navigation).

Safety regulation:

It is strictly forbidden to carry weapons or drugs on board.

Please note that the yacht crosses various borders and that therefore the coastguard searches yachts in the fight against drugs, every now and again. The skipper has the right at any time, to dismiss people from the boat who do not respect the instructions of visiting countries, carry weapons or drugs, disturb the life on board in any way, or put the crew, the guests or the yacht under any kind of danger. The skipper in such a case is obliged to inform the public authorities. In such a case, or if the guest wishes to leave the boat, nothing of the traveling expenses will be refunded.

Depending on the weather, it may happen that part of the distance has to be covered by the engine.

A mediterranean climate dominates in Corsica. Summers are hot. The temperature is maximum about 36°C. The average water temperature is 25 degree Celsius.

ITINÉRAIRE



Day 1 : Macinaggio (30 km north of Bastia)

Meet at 6pm at the Macinaggio marina to board your catamaran. You'll fall under the spell of this small seaside village on Cap Corse. After settling into your cabins, your crew will brief you on safety rules and life on board over a welcome cocktail, followed by dinner. The first night will be spent in a sheltered anchorage on Cap Corse, in Meria.

Day 2 : Macinaggio - Capraia Island

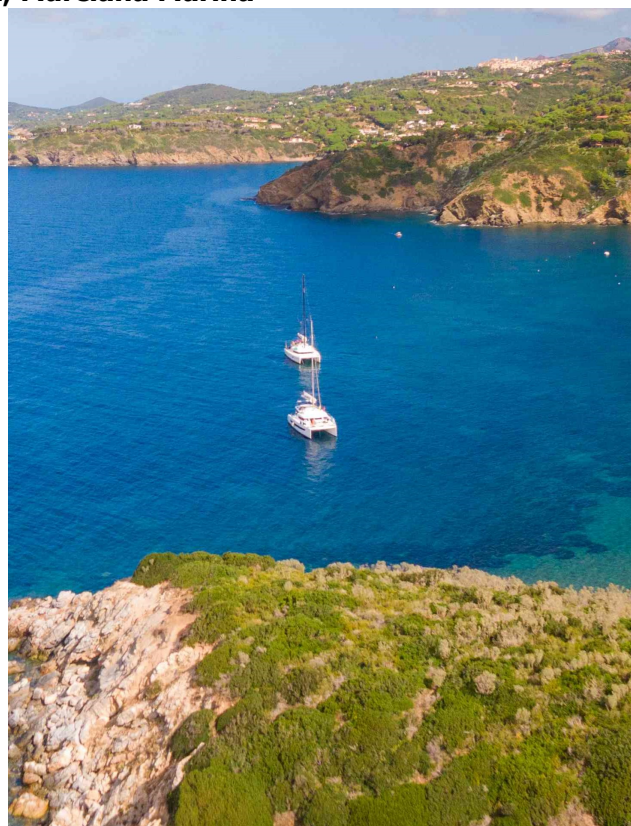
At around 8 a.m., after a hearty breakfast, you'll weigh anchor for a four-hour trip east to Capraia. You'll sail into the open sea of the Pelagos sanctuary, Europe's largest marine reserve, where large cetaceans and dolphins are frequently spotted. The wild and unspoilt Capraia reveals its untouched hills, covered in maquis: the arrival on its coast is spectacular.

After anchoring at Porto Vecchio, the small port with its colorful houses, you'll be eager to disembark and explore the area. The best way to get to the island's only village, perched on its promontory, is to take the €1 shuttle bus, which passes through the port every quarter of an hour. In terms of culture, the late-Baroque church of Saint-Nicolas and the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and the Genoese fortress are particularly impressive. Follow the village's charming narrow streets to the Torre del Porto for a splendid panoramic view. On your way back to the port, stop off at La Gelateria to refresh yourself with a famous ice cream. If the heat isn't too

great, hikers can choose one of the many paths through the island's fragrant scrubland. The remains of the old prison are only an hour's walk away. For the less sporty, there's swimming and walking in and around the village. Dinner and overnight at anchor in the marina.



Day 3 : Capraia Isola - crossing to the island of Elba, Marciana Marina



In the morning, you'll leave Porto Vecchio for a leisurely sail along Capraia's east coast, admiring its cliffs and succession of rocky, crystal-clear coves. At the southern tip of the island, admire Cala Rossa, one of the most spectacular coves in the Mediterranean.

The contrast between the sanguine volcanic rocks of the wall that falls sheer into the sea and the whiteness of the Zenobito promontory is striking. Leaving Capraia behind, we'll make our way to the island of Elba, which we'll approach via Marciana Marina, a charming port village nestling at the foot of Mount Capanne. After lunch, you can take the 116 bus (€3 round trip) up to the cabinovia cable car (€20 round trip), which takes you up to the summit of Mount Capanne (1019m) in around 20 minutes, aboard small yellow gondolas. The 360° view over Elba, the Tuscan islands, Cap Corse and the Italian coast is breathtaking. On the way back, enjoy a swim on Marciana beach before returning to your catamaran. Dinner and overnight at anchor.

Day 4 : Marciana Marina - Gulf of Viticcio - Portoferraio

Depart Marciana in the morning to skim the coast towards Portoferraio. Elba offers more than seventy beaches, so it's always difficult to choose, but in this area we particularly like those of the Gulf of Viticcio, surrounded by a cliff covered with pine trees and scrubland, or Enfolà, where you can see the sea on both sides of the island. Your captain will find you the best anchorages for swimming and lunch. In the afternoon, we'll head for the island's capital, Portoferraio. Its splendid harbour, a haven for ships since antiquity and judged by Admiral Nelson to be the safest in the world, and the island's iron deposits are the source of its incredibly rich history. Founded by the Medici on the remains of the Roman city of Fabricia, Portoferraio has retained all the charm of the Renaissance. The narrow streets of the historic center are welcoming and lively, and a stroll at the end of the day is a real pleasure, including the warm Italian atmosphere. Dinner and overnight at quay or anchorage.

Day 5 : Portoferraio – Ortano – Porto Azzurro

Depart Portoferraio in the morning to round Elba to the northeast. Our first stop of the day is Ortano, with its beach and islet of the same name. A former iron mining center, the quay where ore was loaded onto ships still exists. The sea is particularly transparent at Ortano, making it a great place for snorkeling around the islet. After lunch, a short sail takes you to Porto Azzurro. This charming fishing village nestles at the head of the Gulf of Mola. It's renowned for its seaside atmosphere and its many nearby beaches, including Barba rossa. If you like hiking, push on to the Sanctuary of Montserrat, nestled in the wilderness 3km from the village. After dinner on board, don't hesitate to return ashore to enjoy the lively summer evenings.

Day 6 : Porto Azzurro - Innamorata - Marina di Campo



You'll continue your tour of Elba, rounding Cape Calamita on your way to Innamorata beach. This romantic cove takes its name from the legend of Lorenzo and Maria. The story goes that Maria, the lover, in an attempt to save her lover kidnapped by Barbarossa's pirates, threw herself into the sea and drowned. All that was found was her shawl on a rock, now known as the Scarf.

Opposite Innamorata, the two small Gemini islands are a wonderful playground for gentle water sports. So rent a paddle, kayak, flippers, masks and snorkels to explore them.

After a siesta, head for Marina di Campo. Set in one of Elba's deepest gulfs, the wide beach of Marina di Campo faces the island of Montecristo (closed to pleasure boating). Its one-and-a-half kilometers of fine golden sand are bordered by the seaside village and the charming little port. Like all Elba's little ports. Dinner and overnight at anchor.

Day 7 : Marina di Campo - Fetovaia - Cap Corse



Leaving the gulf of Marina di Campo, we sail quietly towards the beach of Fetovaia. Protected by an 800-metre promontory jutting out into the sea and covered in wild scrub, the Fetovaia cove is a paradise. The color of the sea ranges from deep blue to light green as you approach the white sand. A favorite with summer visitors, discovering it aboard your catamaran is a privilege. After this last Elboise stopover, set sail for a five-hour sail to the Cap Corse coast, some 30 miles to the west, to reach the Meria marina or the port of Macinaggio. Maybe the dolphins will show up! Farewell party and overnight at anchor or quayside.

Day 8 : Macinaggio

By 9am at the latest this morning, after breakfast, it'll be time to say goodbye to your fellow cruisers - if you didn't know them before this Tyrrhenian Sea odyssey - and your crew.

Please note: Depending on sailing conditions, this programme may be reversed at the captain's discretion, so that the first stop is in Fetovaia and the last in Capraia.
